

- Address Search Service
  - Input: name (of a geographical spot)
  - Output: address (of the spot)
- Nearest Train Station Search Service
  - Input: address (of arbitrary place)
  - Output: station name
- Transit Guide Service
  - Input: two station names
  - Output: transit path between the stations

#### The points of interest:


- SA (serve alike) versus ND (non derivative service)

## Permissive Licenses with Multiple Licensing

- Dual (multiple) licensing allows more permissive use
  - BY-SA+ = BY(-NC)?-[SA|ND]
    = BY-SA | BY-ND | BY-NC-SA | BY-NC-ND
  - NC-SA+ = (BY-)?NC-[SA|ND] = NC-SA | NC-ND | BY-NC-SA | BY-NC-ND
  - BY-NC-SA+ = BY-NC-[SA|ND]
    = BY-NC-SA | BY-NC-ND

## Related Work: License Ontology – Ideal, but a Long Way Ahead

- ODRL-S (ODRL Services Profile)
  - Unambiguously represents service licensing clauses (based on formalization of licensing clauses),
  - Is simple yet powerful and fully extensible language,
  - Can specify licenses at service level and service operation level,
  - Can be used with any of existing service description standards and languages, and

 Is developed as a completely compatible profile with ODRL for describing a service license.

ODRL = Open Digital Rights Language


